Bailey's Bulletin is published three times per year.


Central Mountain School Closures

As students and teachers across Hamilton prepare for the annual summer holidays, the dismissal bell at three Mountain schools - Linden Park, Eastmount Park and Cardinal Heights - will ring for the final time.

In September, the students from the closed schools will attend Franklin Road, G. L. Armstrong, Pauline Johnson, Queensdale and Ridgemount Schools.

The Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board is currently considering changing the names of these five schools and will announce their decision this June.

The Mountain Heritage Society believes that the existing school names have significance and are an important part of the identity of their former students. The names should not only be retained, they should be celebrated. We have written to the renaming committee and to the Hamilton Spectator to make our view known. Heritage Comes Home

The annual Heritage Day event was held at Hamilton City Hall on Feb. 21st. Local heritage groups, including our society, set up displays for the public before the annual awards ceremony took place in the Council Chambers.

The Hamilton Historical Board announced Raymond "Rapid Ray" Lewis as the winner of the **Greatest Hamiltonian** contest for 2015. Ray Lewis (1910-2003) was a celebrated track and field athlete, and the first Canadian-born black Olympic medalist. A Mountain school was named in his honour in 2005. A public ceremony is planned for George Hamilton Day, Monday, August 3rd, at the Canadian Football Hall of Fame (58 Jackson St. W.) at 11 a.m.

The **Reverend T. Melville Bailey Heritage Award** for 2014 was awarded to Bill Manson. Bill is a retired educator and amateur historian who has written four books on local heritage.

Pearl and Bob Davie were selected by our society to receive **Hamilton-Wentworth Heritage Association Volunteer Recognition Awards**. This dynamic duo joined the Society in 2002. In 2005 they volunteered to help out at Concession Streetfest, and have been at every one since. Pearl has a persuasive personality that she puts to good use: our organizer calls her an 'outstanding salesperson'. It is thanks to great people like Pearl and Bob that the Hamilton Mountain Heritage Society can have a public presence.



In Memoriam

Ron Francey passed away on December 29, 2014 in his 96th year. He lived on the Mountain for over 80 years and was a good historian with a keen memory and great stories. He was a history advisor on the Publications Committee for *Mountain Memories*.

Joseph Rymal Woolley passed away on March 3rd in his 86th year. He was a descendant of Mountain pioneer William Rymal and was involved with our society in producing the Rymal Family Heritage plaque, located at the corner of Upper Paradise and Mohawk Rd. Recently he organized a petition requesting that the city rename Schwenger Park to honour the Rymal family.

Concession Street Construction and Streetscape Project

The Concession Street Festival will not be taking place this year because of road and sidewalk construction. The project is scheduled to be completed by December of this year and the Society is looking forward to having our display tables set up at next year's new and improved Streetfest.

In the meantime shops and restaurants along the street will continue to be open during the construction and would appreciate your business.


Olivet United Church is celebrating their centennial this year. The first church pictured here opened in 1916.


