The South Gate Presbyterian Church 65th Anniversary

Rev. Dr. T.M. Bailey was a well known historian and minister. Μv father came from a family that was very strong and passionate about faith. In 1949, with the vision of a church on Hamilton Mountain, he organized а congregation in Buchanan Hall on Upper James Street. From these humble beginnings The South Gate Presbyterian Church was built at 120 Clarendon Avenue in 1954, the year that Mel graduated with his Master of Divinity degree from Knox College in Toronto, and was ordained.

Mel loved history and, throughout the years, wrote many books. He was a big supporter of the preservation of Auchmar as he lived behind it. I have carried on his love of history and am the historian of The South Gate Church.

The South Gate Church is verv active in the community. Reid Thompson, Rev. Robert Geddes and our present minister Rev. Charmain Sebestven. We are continuing to keep the church relevant in the community.

Hamilton Senior of the Year Awards

The Award is given annually by the Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration to one outstanding local Ontarian in each municipality who, at 65 years of age or beyond, has voluntarily contributed to their community.

Counselor Ann Bruce

In June, the Society received news that a member of the executive, Counselor Ann Bruce, had passed away at the age of 38. Ann had joined the Executive at the Annual Meeting in January.

Ann was a social justice advocate; Hamiltonian; radio show host of "Hamilton's Finest" at McMaster Student Radio CFMU 93.3; co-chair of Trade Justice Group with the Hamilton chapter of the Council of Canadians; and tenor singer (female tenor) with the St. Joseph's 11:30 a.m. choir and the community choir of Mohawk College. Ann loved choral, piano, classical and jazz music. Her fellow choristers beautiful music held a special place in her heart. Ann opened up her own legal practice which included Hamilton, Toronto and Cambridge. She worked as Duty Counsel at the John Sopinka Courthouse and the Unified Family Court. Ann will be missed by many friends and family.
